Monitoring Student Applications

Once an exchange agreement is formalised, you will be given log-in access to our application management system – *StudyLink Connect*. You can use these details to view the status of the students' applications, their course approvals, and communication with the Admissions Officers. Logging in to the application system is not required, though you may find it to be useful. Please take note that the log-in details should *not* be shared with students as they provide access to personal or private information. If you do not have log-in details and would like them to be resent to you, please contact the relevant Mobility Officer.

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Important Notes		
Student Transcripts	UniSA transcripts are issued digitally via <u>My eQuals</u> , an online system used by universities in Australia and New Zealand to issue electronic transcripts. Transcripts shared on 'My eQuals' are official and digitally certified. Students are not able to edit or tamper with them in any way unless they send a PDF copy – please do not accept PDF copies of 'My eQuals' transcripts.	
	Instructions on how to access and share UniSA transcript will be sent to the student's UniSA email address the week following result release. Students will need to specify the email address they want to share their transcript with. Once they have elected to share via 'My eQuals', you will receive an email notification – the email should also have the UniSA logo and the My eQuals logo. Select the 'View Document' link in the email, which will direct you to a webpage. You'll need to enter your email address and select 'Verify'. The document can then be viewed and downloaded. If you require hard-copy transcripts, please email our office and they will be posted as soon as possible.	
	Students from non-English speaking countries must meet a minimum satisfactory level of English proficiency by providing evidence of one of the following:	
	TOEFL score of 60 (internet-based) taken within the last two years	
	IELTS (academic) score of 6.0 taken within the last two years.	
English Language Requirement	In lieu of providing an objective English test, students from the countries listed below can meet the standard English requirement by providing a language proficiency letter from their home institution stating they have proficiency at CEFR B2 level or better:	
	Austria, Belgium, Canada (French-speaking), Denmark, Estonia, France, Finland, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland.	
English Language for Student Visa	Due to recent changes to the Government regulations around Student Visa processing, students of certain nationalities may be required to provide the Department of Home Affairs evidence of an English test that meets the Department's requirements, despite individual arrangements between institutions: https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/student-500#Eligibility	
	The University needs to ensure that students who might be asked to present this evidence have it readily available, as being unable to present this evidence to the Department of Home Affairs will result in a student's visa refusal.	
English Language Intensive Courses for Overseas Students (ELICOS)	UniSA partners with the Centre for English Language (CELUSA) to deliver high-quality Academic English language preparation programs for international undergraduate and postgraduate students. If your students are unable to meet the University's language requirements and would like to package their exchange semester with an intensive English course, we will be happy to arrange this. Please keep in mind that this will need to be flagged well in advance in order for the students to have time to complete the English course <i>prior</i> to commencement of their exchange semester.	
Overseas Student Health Cover	It is s a requirement of the Australian government that anyone who enters Australia on a Student Visa must obtain Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of their visa. UniSA have negotiated with a major OSHC provider for competitive rates for our students. When students receive their offer for study with UniSA, it will include a quote for the OSHC via our preferred provider, <u>Bupa</u> . Students can of course opt to obtain OSHC on their own terms through another provider, though the prices offered through Bupa are quite good, and this also means that we take on the administrative work of arranging the cover.	
	The cost of OSHC for our incoming students is roughly AU\$50 per month, though this figure may change year on year. If a student returns home before the end date on their visa they can apply for a refund of any remaining amount paid.	
Student Services and Amenities Fee	The Student Services and Amenities Fee is a compulsory fee which is paid by all students, including those on exchange. The SSAF is to support services of a non-academic nature — students are invoiced for the SSAF during their semester. Fees are charged dependent on the number of courses taken and are up to \$163 per semester for students enrolled full time. More information is available at: https://i.unisa.edu.au/fees/ssaf
