2. Our Wide-Ranging Academic Programs

Between its undergraduate faculties and graduate schools, Keio offers an extensive range of subjects, including numerous **degree programs offered entirely in English**. 3 undergraduate faculties and 9 of Keio's graduate schools offer degree programs in English. The **GIGA Program**, launched in 2011 and taught in English, seamlessly integrates information and communication technology and governance. The Faculty of Economics, as one of the most renowned in Japan, has launched its **PEARL Program** to train the next generation of business leaders in Asia and the world.



Keio has over 300 partner institutions overseas and is one of the top universities in Japan for its number and quality of **double degree programs** with top universities abroad.

Keio also values Japanese language education. The **Japanese Language Program** provides students with high quality Japanese language training and fosters students' specialist knowledge of Japan.

3. A Safe and Inclusive Learning Environment

Where you live is just as important as where you study. 5. A Close-Knit Community of Alumni



Application Guide for Keio Exchange Program

Updated: December 27, 2022

Eligibility

- › Must be enrolled at one of Keio University's partner universities
- › Must have student status at your home university throughout your period of study at Keio University
- › Must be formally nominated as an exchange student by your home university

Application Deadline

The application must be submitted Keio University NO LATER than the deadlines below.

2023 Fall Admission	March 30 , 2023
2024 Spring Admission	October 5, 2023

Important Notice

- › If you are a transfer student and wish to apply for the JLP, you must have completed at least one semester at your home university (nominating institution) at the time of application. You must be able to submit a transcript and a recommendation letter from your home university.
- › Incomplete applications will not be processed.
- › Your application will be reviewed by the selection committee of each program.
- › Acceptance to Keio is confirmed once you receive your acceptance letter. We recommend that you do NOT purchase an airline ticket prior to receiving your official letter of acceptance.
- › Extending your study period is not permitted. Please plan and choose your study period very carefully when you apply.
- › No credits or certificate will be given if you are not enrolled until the end of the course and miss the exams. No exceptions will be made for those who wish to leave early due to academic schedule conflicts or graduation from your home institution. Please check our "Academic Calendar" and "Important Dates", and consult with your home institution well in advance.
- › There is no Japanese proficiency required to apply to be an exchange students at Keio University.

JASSO Scholarship

Scholarships such as JASSO are available but are NOT guaranteed for all the exchange students since the number of recipients is limited.

Housing Information

Housing

Keio assists students in arranging accommodation in Japan. Students are provided with a room at one of the student dormitories subsidized by Keio University. In some dormitories, weekday meals are included in the fee.

Usually, students are required to pay rent through automatic debiting from their bank account each month, but sometimes the first and the last month's rent may be paid in cash at the counter of Office of Student Services. The rent charged to students varies from ¥55,000 - ¥78,400 (The rent is subject to change). Students will also be charged ¥20,000 maintenance fee on their first month's rent. Deposits and key charge are not required.

Note:

- › Due to the current capacity of student dormitories, once you leave your originally assigned dormitory, you are not allowed to return to the room, or move to another Keio dormitory.
- › Keio does not arrange or introduce a home stay program for exchange students.
